


# Yokai and Gourmet! Fukusaki Town Area Sightseeing Map

current location!


This site is linked to Google Maps, so you

places connected to Kunio Yanagita

[Start & Goal: Tsujikawa Tourism and Exchange Center]



Travel around the places where Kunio Yanagita,  
the father of Japanese folklore studies, spent his  
childhood and experience the scenery he saw  
for yourself. You may even catch a glimpse of the  
world of folklore. Make the most of the charms  
of Fukusaki Town with this route. There's a  
Memorial Museum, a shrine for scholarly  
success, the area's specialty product mochimugi  
(barley), and even yokai.
